Report relative to the death of William Guy Banister, WN-63, formerly residing 1031 Moss St., Apt. No. B.

SIR:

Patrolmen F. Wilson and F. Hayward, in company with Police Recruit R.Busby reports of receiving a call to investigate a Signal No. 29, death, at 1034 Moss Ptreet, at 7:06 P.M. on June 6, 1964.

On arrival the officers learned that there was no such address, however the officers observed two white females and one white male standing in front of a white frame double house, bearing Municipal No. 1031 Moss St. These persons were waving at the officers and the officers went to this location.

It was learned from the white hale, who identified himself as I.E. Nitschke, M59, residing 5202 Conti Street, Telephone No. 482-2323, a former associate of the deceased, that the Secretary Treasurer of GUY BANISTER ASSOCIATES, Inc., Delphine P.Roberts, WF43, residing 6569 Wureple St., had come to his residence and explained that she thought there was something wrong with Guy Banister. Miss Roberts was also on the scene. Mr. Nitschke further explained t at he, his wife and Miss Roberts then drove to door, Mr. Nitschke forced open the door which was locked. He, upon entering discovered the body of Guy Banister laying on the bed, apparently dead. Mr. Nitschke immediately telephoned the police.

The officers on entering the apartment bearing No. B, which is located on the ground floor of the building, the door being on the right side of the building and found the deceased clad only in a pair of boxer type shorts, laying on his right side diagonally across the sofa type bed. Mr.Banister was apparently dead.

Officers Wilson and Hayward, after notifing the proper authorities via police radio of the situation, interviewed Miss Delphine Roberts, an associate of the deceased and probably the last person to see him alive. It was learned that Mr. Banister had picked her up at their office at approximately 5:30 P.M. on June 5, 1964, the previous day and drove to her residence where Mr complained at this time of not feeling too well and left at approximately 7:00 P.M. for his residence. Miss Roberts stated that she did not hear from Mr. Banister further and on several to no avail. Miss Roberts, concerned about Mr. Banister, after door locked, and receiving no response, decided to call on Mr.

Paga Nia

Nitschke, a former associate and close friend of Mr. Banister who lived in the vicinity.

Mr. Nitschke stated that Mr. Banister had no relatives inNew Orleans, La. to his knowledge, with the exception of an estranged

Sergeant A. Polito, Platoon Commander, arrived on the scene at 7:35 P.M. and supervised the investigation.

Detective Sergeant C.Drumm and Detective D. Kent, of the Homicide Division, Technician George Steib of the B of I, Sam Moran, Special Investigator for the Orleans Parish Coroner's Office arrived on the scene, and conducted their investigation.

Dr. Nicholas Chetta, Orleans Parish Coroner arrived on the scene at 8:00 P.M. and pronounced Mr. Banister dead, at 8:022P.M.

Sam Moran removed the following property from the trouser pockets of the deceased, which were laying on a small talbe beside

- -1- Black handled switch blade knife, approximately 4 " closed.
- -28- \$10.00 bills
  - -5- \$1.00 bills.
- -6- \$ .05 coins. -1- 3 .01 .coin.
- -1- 30 calibre cartridge, live.

The following property was removed from the apartment of Mr. Banister by Sam Moran:

-1- 30 Calibre bolt action rifle.

-2- Over and under shot guns, make and calibre unknown.

The body was transported to the City Morgue, in the Coroner's Wagon chauffeured by O. Mills.
