Q. Did your son tell you before he left for Russia that he was going?

A. No. Now I think, gentlemen, that we will stop the interview because we are going into my life history and I am awfully tired. I just wanted to -uh - express my thanks to the -uh- press. They have helped me considerably to bring my position before the Warren Commission. I am under the impression that that is why I am here. I have -uh - repeatedly made statements that I believe in our American way of life. I have tried to get Mr. Mark Lane to represent my son as an attorney before the Warren Commission. However I have failed. But that does not mean that we are not going to continue to fight for our American way of life.

Q. Do you expect to see anybody else in the Government before you leave town?

A. No, I stay here now.
